| Synagogue | Place of Worship for religious Jews |
| Torah | The first 5 books of the Tanakh- Jewish Holy book |
| Shabbat | Celebrated each week to remind Jews that God rested on the 7 th day after creation |
| Passover | Celebrating freedom from Egypt by God through Moses |
| Bar/Bat Mitzvah | When Boys and girls become adults |
| Wailing Wall - Jerusalem | The holiest site for Jews- the last piece of the temple in Jerusalem |
| Bystander | Someone who stands by and does nothing to stop wrong things happening |
| Upstander | Someone who stands up for what is right |
| Memorial | Something to help [people remember something important |
| Kindertransport | The name for the evacuation of Jewish children from Germany |
| Pre-war | Before the war started |
| Prejudice | Judging someone or something before you know anything about it. |
| Persecution | Acting in a harmful way to someone- extreme form of bullying |
| Anti- Semitism | Racism against Jewish people |
| Kristallnacht | The night of broken glass |
