EYFS	The children will sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs. They will perform songs, poems and stories with others and when appropriate, try to move in time to the music.		
Y1	Hey You! (Charanga): Rap Music This unit is an old-school hip hop style for children to learn about the differences between pulse, rhythm and pitch to learn about rap and enjoy it in its original form	Recorders: An introduction to recorders - how to hold the recorder, learning the notes B and A performance.	Chants and Rhymes: The children will learn different chants, rhymes and songs and will put actions and movement to them.
Y2	Drumming: Introduction to drumming - copying different beats/ patterns with rests in and improvising.	Wartime Songs: The children will learn a range of wartime songs. They will put actions to some of the songs. They will discuss the importance of these songs.	Hands, Feet, Heart, (Charanga): (South African Music) The children will learn to sing, improvise and compose music. They will listen and appraise different styles of South African music
Y3	Stone Age Rhythms: Creating rhythms linked to stone Age activities and creating music to represent these activities. Use Garageband to create a piece of Stone age music.	Bringing Us Together (Charanga): (Disco) The children will learn to sing, play, improvise and compose. The children will listen and appraise other Disco songs.	Ukulele: Introduction to playing the ukulele.
Y4	Mama Mia (Charanga): (ABBA/ Musicals) The children will learn to sing, play, improvise and compose with the well-known song Mama Mia, children will listen and appraise more ABBA hits. They will use glockenspiels	Singing including Roman Songs/ history: 2 lessons are based on Romans. The children will learn songs. They will look at chants, ostinatos, singing rounds, and partner songs.	Recorders: The children will build on their recorder lessons from Year 1. They will also compose their own pieces on the recorder using the notes they have learnt.
Y5	Music from different islands around the world: - Rivers, Mountains and Islands. (Reggae) Looking at and appraising music from around the world and looking at the history of it. Children play the glockenspiel in this unit.	Garageband: The children will complete a piece of music on Garageband which reflects a Viking battle and its intensity.	Livin on a Prayer (Charanga): (Rock) The children will learn to sing, play, improvise and compose with the song 'Livin on a Prayer'. They will also listen to and appraise other classic rock songs.
Y6	You've Got a Friend (Charanga Unit): (Film Music) The work is based around the song 'You've Got a Friend' by Carol King and will involve whole class instrument playing of glockenspiels, recorders and other instruments taught during their time at Lantern Lane.	The Americans: Listening to 'The Little Train of Caipira' 'and composing music based on this piece They will use tuned, untuned instruments and their voices in their compositions.	Music and Me (Charanga Unit): (Inspirational Women) The unit focuses on inspirational women working in music. Four female contemporary artists will be studied.
